<p><b>Macro Photography</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Small objects or areas of objects you use almost every day</li> <li>-The contents of your locker</li> <li>-The contents of your backpack wallet, or purse</li> <li>- A still life of food related items found in the cafeteria</li> <li>- Plants and insects found outside</li> <li>- WHAT ELSE?</li> </ul>	<p><i>Macro photography refers to close-up photography where the subject is as large or larger than life size when it appears on the sensor.</i></p> <p><b>Take a series of three Macro pictures that relate to a common theme.</b></p> <p>Begin by practicing using the Macro setting on your camera. At high magnification, depth of field (DOF) is greatly reduced. The Macro default mode will set a smaller aperture (high F#) to overcome focusing issues.</p> <p>Next, fine tune the camera's settings (F#, Shutter Speed, ISO) to create a desired (or unexpected!) effect..</p>	<p><b>Composition:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Apply the Rule of Thirds</li> </ul> <p><b>Technique:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The focal point (in the foreground) should be sharply in focus</li> <li>- The background should be out of focus</li> <li>- Use a tripod to avoid camera shake (blurry images)</li> </ul> <p><b>Communication:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Be creative in your subject matter and approach. Photo should be interesting, dynamic, compelling!</li> </ul> <p><b>Application:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Save 3 good images total</li> <li>- Log 10 shots total</li> <li>- No post prod. allowed</li> <li>- Save as FirstLastMacro#(1, 2, 3).jpg</li> </ul> <p><b><u>AS ALWAYS:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <b>Record Aperture, Shutter Speed, and ISO settings for each</b></li> <li>- <b>Image should be correctly focused (not blurry when/where it shouldn't be)</b></li> <li>- <b>Image should be correctly exposed (not under/over exposed or grainy)</b></li> </ul>
